# **SUMMARY**

This document presents the work develoed by the Technical Secretariat (TS) for the Race to Resilience Campaign during the year 2022.

Throughout the experience gained during the year, it was possible to consolidate the Campaign, its relationship with its Partners, and its Monitoring & Evaluation system, as well as positioning it as a key reference in the global climate arena and paving the way for delivering its full impact in the upcoming years.

The Technical Secretariat also achieved to provide the R2R Campaign with credibility, transparency and robustness of the commitments of the R2R Campaign and its partners. Also to promote process for co-learning and co-production among the different actors of the R2R Campaign.

The Technical Secretariat has achieved the total of the objectives defined in the Terms of Reference for the year 2022. Complementary to that, the TS has been working on:

- The review of new initiatives.
- The assistance of the MAG and ERG.
- The relationship with partners.
- The outreach of the Campaign.

Although this report focuses on the work completed in 2022, as the R2R campaign is now in its third year, it is important to understand the accumulated accomplishments achieved to date by the R2R Technical Secretariat. 

# METHODOLOGICAL ADVISORY GROUP (MAG)

The MAG is an advisory body composed of experts from different organizations. The group is co-led by the 3 members from the University of Maryland, International Institute for Sustainable Development (IISD) and the International Institute for Environment and Development (IIED)

Their role is to improve & validate the R2R framework and metrics.

# **EXPERT REVIEW GROUP**

## (ERG)

The ERG is an advisory body composed of experts from different geographies, backgrounds and expertise. They were selected through an open call for applications from a competitive pool of applicants. They are members of academia, subnational governments, the private sector and civil society organizations. Together, they hold vast experience as practitioners or researchers working on resilience and adaptation to climate change.

Their role is to provide advice to the Race to Resilience campaign and the High-Level Champions on issues such as: which initiatives should be included in the campaign and how those initiatives and their members could improve their procedural criteria. They also advise on the overall progress of Race to Resilience and make recommendations to Champions on how the campaign can be strengthened.

#### Currently, in December 2022, there are a total of 36 partners.







# RACE TO RESILIENCE METRICS FRAMEWORK

The TS is responsible for designing, applying, analyzing and reporting on metrics allowing to gauge the commitments and progress of the R2R Partners in making people more resilient worldwide.

During the year 2022, the framework was improved, incorporating aspects to allow the operationalisation in the reporting tool.

In that sense, the articulation with other worldwide frameworks was key:

#### **FRAMEWORK**

The Framework is the cornerstone of the Race to Resilience Campaign.

It serves as a guide for partners in taking action and for the HLC Team on how to manage and foster their work.

It is composed of two complementary sets of metrics:



#### **Quantitative**

Quantitative or magnitude metrics that help estimate the effect size of the impact, fundamentally through the number of beneficiaries reached. Beneficiaries can be individuals (distingushing direct and indirect beneficiaries), companies, cities, regions and natural systems (the latter measured in hectares).



#### **Qualitative**

Qualitative or depth metrics, which help understand how the partners and their members are contributing to increasing resilience of people vulnerable to climate change, by observing on which key conditions (Resilience Attributes) are making a change.

The famework allows for the tracking of the partner's progress across 5 stages:



As of the end of 2022, the Tool is composed of 4 surveys, providing information on the partners and their progress through the Pledge and Plan stages.



#### **General Information Survey**




#### **Pledge Statement Survey**


